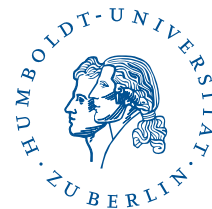

“Passages to India – Suez, the Indian Travellers’ Pathway”

This Keynote Lecture will focus on late 19th-century Indian travellers who came to the UK via the Suez Canal. The talk’s findings will offer reflections on cultural migration, late imperial modernity, and what might be called reverse colonial migration.

Professor Boehmer is an internationally renowned expert for postcolonial theory and writing. Her research focuses on colonial and postcolonial literature, imperial history and histories of Empire, especially in India, Africa and Australasia. Elleke Boehmer is Professor of World Literature in English and Deputy Director of the Oxford Centre for Life-Writing at Wolfson College.
