The vote to remain in the UK, in the Scottish independence referendum in 2014, did not settle the matter. Nor did it weaken the pro-independence party, the Scottish National Party. Major constitutional change remains high on the agenda, particularly during the run up to a referendum on the UK's exit from the EU. This lecture highlights the tendency for limited public and parliamentary scrutiny of substantive policy issues when they are viewed through a constitutional lens.

Paul Cairney is Professor of Politics and Public Policy, University of Stirling, UK. His research interests are in comparative public policy. He published *Scottish Politics* (2013), Handbook of Complexity and Public Policy (2015), and The Politics of Evidence-based Policymaking (2016).
