Prof Dr Cornelius Torp sums up the different developments of pension provision in Britain and Germany since the Second World War. He emphasises the divergent ideas of social justice which were inscribed in the two pension systems.

Cornelius Torp is Professor of Modern History at the Freie Universität Berlin. He has published widely on Modern German and European History, the History of Globalization and on the History of the Welfare State. He is the author of *Challenges of Aging: Pensions, Retirement and Social Justice* (2015).
