The countryside is cherished by many Britons. There is a depth of feeling about rural places, the moors and lochs, valleys and mountains, cottages and country houses. Yet the British countryside, so integral to national identity, is rarely seen as having anything to do with colonialism. Corinne Fowler brings rural life and colonial rule together to describe how imperial wealth transformed the British countryside and intensified land struggles. The talk reflects on these histories through a series of country walks featured in Corinne's book, Our Island Stories: Country Walks Through Colonial Britain (Penguin, April 2024).
